It is all a matter of perspective.

As we begin a new year, January invites reflection—and resolve. At Turning Point, we enter 2026 grounded in a powerful truth: ending domestic violence is not the work of one organization alone. It is the work of an informed, engaged, and courageous community.

That is why our focus has been simple, yet transformative: Educate. Activate. Advocate.

Educate.

Domestic violence is often misunderstood. It is not defined by a single incident, visible injury, or stereotype. It is a pattern of power and control that can affect anyone—regardless of age, gender, income, culture, or background. Education is the first step in shifting perspectives. When we understand the warning signs, the barriers survivors face, and the long-term impact of trauma, we replace judgment with compassion and silence with awareness. Every conversation, classroom presentation, and shared resource helps dismantle myths and create a safer, more informed community.



Activate.

Education must move us to action. When community members are activated, they become part of the solution—checking in on a neighbor, supporting a friend, volunteering, attending an event, or sharing resources. Activation is about recognizing that small actions matter. Questioning comments that are based in shame and blame. “Challenging the dismissive why doesn’t she...” It is about choosing to show up, speak up, and step forward. At Turning Point, we see every day how collective action strengthens survivors and builds pathways to safety and healing.

Advocate.

Advocacy is where lasting change takes root. It means using our voices to challenge systems, policies, and attitudes that allow violence to persist. Advocacy happens when we support survivor-centered services, promote trauma-informed responses,

and insist that domestic violence is not a private issue—it is a community issue. Together, we can influence how institutions respond, how resources are allocated, and how survivors are treated when they seek help.

Compassion is the net result of Education and Advocacy that has been activated. Changing a community's perspective on domestic violence does not happen overnight. But it does happen—through education that informs, action that empowers, and advocacy that transforms. I am continually inspired by the individuals, partners, and supporters who stand with Turning Point in this work.

Your commitment reminds survivors that they are not alone and reminds our community that change is possible.

As we move forward into this new year, I invite you to join us in educating, activating, and advocating. Together, we are not only responding to domestic violence—we are reshaping the culture that surrounds it.

Turning Point is the only comprehensive domestic violence agency in McHenry County. Our services for survivors include a 24/7 helpline, emergency shelter, individual and group counseling, mental health therapy, children's counseling, and legal advocacy. Our survivor services are offered at no cost to the community and are available in both English and Spanish.

Our Alternatives to Violence programs include our Partner Abuse Intervention Program, Survivor's Intervention Program, and Positive Parenting Interventions program. These programs are open to the community and have sliding scale fees.

Turning Point also offers Outreach and Prevention programming to local McHenry County schools and community members.

Our holistic approach ensures that we address domestic violence at every stage—from crisis intervention to prevention—so that we're not just reacting to violence, but actively working to stop it before it begins.

Domestic and intimate partner violence can affect anyone. Turning Point serves everyone and we do not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, religion, gender, or sexual orientation.
